

Master of Architecture Portfolio Instructions

Track 1 and Track 2

Applicants with a preprofessional architecture degree applying to the Master of Architecture Track 1 or Track 2 program must submit a portfolio (30 pages max.) that includes examples of an applicant's related work to date (academic, professional, and/or personal). The portfolio provides evidence of an applicant's knowledge and abilities related to architectural design, technical systems, integrative thinking, and design communication. Applicants should provide graphic and written descriptions for each project included in their portfolio, and be clear about their individual role and/or contribution to any group or professional project.

There are no specific requirements regarding the content of an applicant's portfolio; however, it is recommended that applicants include work that demonstrates knowledge and ability in the following categories:

Architectural Design

Building Composition, Organization, and Function

Conceptual Design Process and/or Diagramming

Small-Scale Building Design

Large-Scale Building Design

Designs that include multiple buildings or Master Planning or Urban Design

Graphic design, furniture/Industrial design, construction, artwork, etc.

General/Technical

Digital visualization, modeling, and architectural design software knowledge/ability

Detailed Building Sections

Integration of Structural Systems

Integration of Building Environmental and Service Systems

Sustainable Design

Construction Detailing (wall section, building details, etc.)

Graphics and Presentation

Composition and Organization

Digital documentation

Other Design-Related Work

Graphic design, furniture/Industrial design, construction, artwork, etc.

Track 3

Applicants without preprofessional architecture degrees applying to the Master of Architecture program Track 3 program should submit a portfolio (30 pages max.) that includes examples of an applicant's creative, technical knowledge, and/or design work to date (academic, professional, and/or personal). The portfolio provides evidence of an applicant's creative, design, and analytical thinking skills.

There are no specific requirements regarding the content of an applicant's portfolio; however, it is recommended that Track 3 applicants include work demonstrating knowledge and ability in the creative categories such as (but not limited to) landscape architecture, urban design, interior design, graphic design, furniture/Industrial design, engineering, construction, photography, fine artwork, sketching, etc. If applicants have architectural design related work, they are encouraged, but not required, to include examples of that work as well. Applicants should provide graphic and written descriptions for each project included in their portfolio, and be clear about their individual role and/or contribution to any group or professional project.
